**1 Name**

This instrument is the *Migration (Granting of Skilled—Recognised Graduate (Subclass 476) Visas in Financial Year 2023–2024) (LIN 23/089) Determination 2023*

**2 Commencement**

**5 Maximum number of visas**

For the purposes of section 39 of the Act and paragraph 476.226(a) of Schedule 2 to the Regulations, the maximum number of Subclass 476 (Skilled – Recognised Graduate) visas that may be granted in the 2023-2024 financial year, between 1 July 2023 and 30 June 2024, is 3,735.

This instrument is repealed on 1 July 2024.
